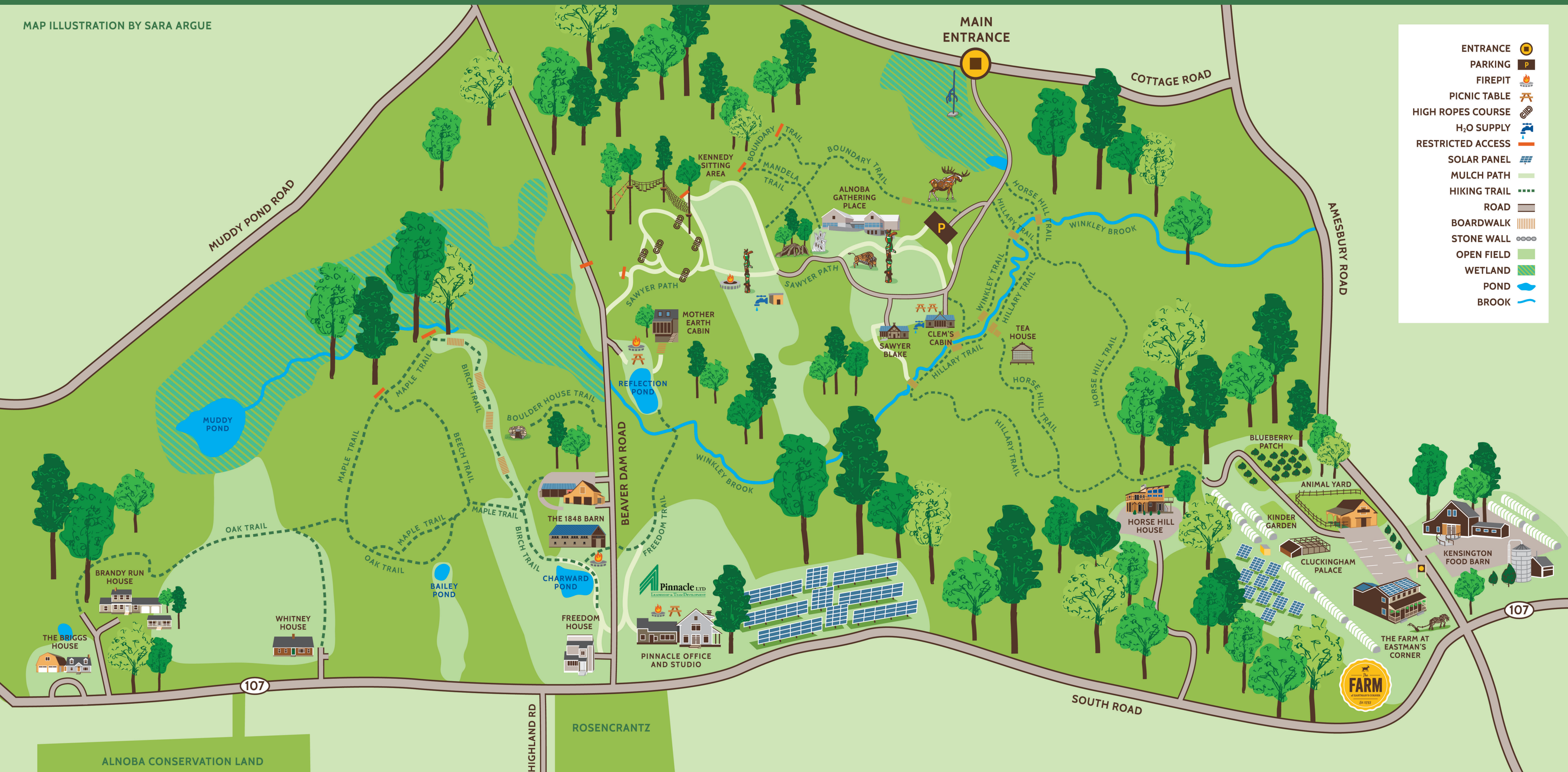

THE 1848 BARN Originally located on Bay Road in Greenland, NH, and slated for demolition, the barn was reconstructed on the banks of Charward Pond and is available for meetings and special events.

PINNACLE OFFICE AND STUDIO The Studio provides a large meeting space, as well as an outdoor gathering place circling a granite fire ring.

FREEDOM HOUSE This cabin was built on the site of a former artist's residence and overlooks Charward Pond.

THE BRIGGS HOUSE Home to generations of the Briggs Family, this South Road three-bedroom house is located about a mile from the main property.

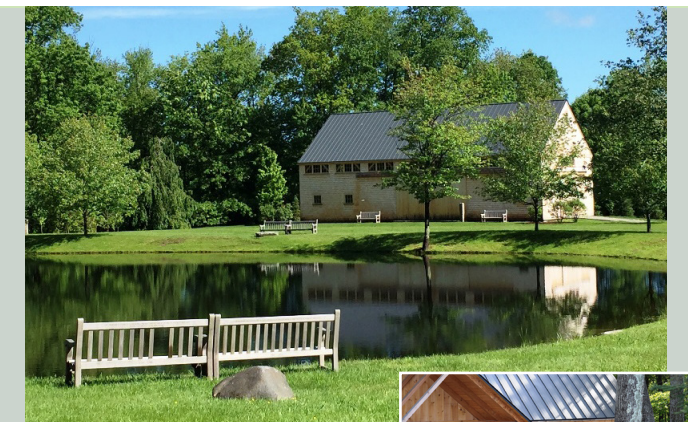
